Environmental Policy

Knightsbridge Furniture Productions Ltd is a manufacturer and supplier of furniture for the contract market. Our principal activities include the processing of timber, foams and fabrics, and our finished products are found in Healthcare, Community Care, Hotel and Leisure, and Ecclesiastical environments.

We recognise that our day-to-day activities impact on the environment in a number of ways, and the Board of Directors are therefore committed to:

- minimising the potentially harmful effects of such activities wherever and whenever possible,
- continually improving our environmental performance through a co-ordinated environmental management system,
- setting environmental objectives and targets, and monitoring the progress of subsequent actions,
- promoting sustainable development through continual environmental improvement.

In particular, Knightsbridge Furniture Productions will:

- comply with all relevant legislation, regarding regulations, laws and codes of practice as the minimum standard for environmental performance,
- take all necessary measures to ensure that our activities prevent the pollution of either water, land or air,
- minimise waste, especially hazardous waste, through careful product design and development, and the use of efficient manufacturing processes,
- reuse or recycle materials whenever possible,
- dispose of all waste through safe and responsible methods,
- minimise energy usage, and ensure that improved energy efficiency is a key factor in any investments in new equipment or processes,
- continue to only use timber that is legally harvested, and that is procured from well managed and sustainable sources,
- continue to convert our wood waste into heat for use in buildings and the manufacturing processes, reducing our consumption of fossil fuels,
- co-ordinate route planning and delivery schedules to reduce congestion, fuel consumption and exhaust emissions,
- provide suitable training of employees, including both general awareness training and job-specific training.

This policy forms the basis of our environmental improvement activities, and the Managing Director is therefore responsible for ensuring that the requirements are met, and that suitable improvement objectives and targets are established and monitored.

The policy is communicated to all employees, reviewed at regular intervals, and made available to the public.
